



JCCricket - GA High School Cricket – 2022 Spring Tournament Rules

Tournament:

The tournament is based on the Laws of Cricket (2017 Code 2nd Edition-2019) and ICC T20 playing conditions and as may be modified by the Playing Conditions of this tournament.

Teams

The teams in this tournament are the following nine (9) teams: Northview HS, S. Forsyth HS, Walton HS, Wheeler HS, Johns Creek HS, Alpharetta HS, Milton HS, Lambert HS and Denmark HS. Each team shall register a minimum of thirteen (13) and a maximum of twenty (20) players. Each registered player shall be a student in grades 6th to 12th and each team shall be allowed to register a maximum of two (2) former players who are freshmen in College.

Players:

To participate, a player shall agree to comply with the following:

1. All rules of this tournament and as may be amended, when deemed necessary by JCCricket.
2. JCCricket Covid-19 Protocols
3. The Playing Conditions document for this tournament.
4. The tournament's dress code. All teams are required to wear the same color cricket uniforms. At a minimum, all players shall wear full length athletic blue or black pants (no belts), same color sports shirts, athletic shoes and socks.
5. The Player's Code of Conduct
6. Adhere to all disciplinary action taken against them by JCCricket's disciplinary committee.

Matches:

1. All matches shall be played at the location, on the day and time indicated on the tournament's schedule or as rescheduled by JCCricket. Matches will only be rescheduled



due to Ground, Weather or Light (GWL) issues and a match will only be rescheduled once.

2. Each team will only be allowed to make up one “rained out” match. An exception would be if the team’s subsequent make up match is against a team that did not previously play a “rained out” match. Rained out matches will be played in the same order as they were initially scheduled.
3. If a league match cannot be played on the rescheduled date/time because of GWL issues, both teams would share the points equally. If the semi-final match cannot be played on the rescheduled date/time because of GWL issues, the higher seeded team will go to the final. If the final match cannot be played on the rescheduled date/time due to GWL issues, both teams would be declared joint champions.
4. If, at the end of the team batting second allotted overs, the scores are tied the winner will be determined by a super over in accordance with ICC current regulations.
5. All players are required to arrive at the location of the match at least an hour before their match is scheduled to start.
6. The toss shall be at 15 minutes before the schedule start or rescheduled start of the match. To toss both teams shall have a minimum of 8 players present and ready to play. If neither team is ready to play at the scheduled or rescheduled time for the toss, the umpires shall wait 5 minutes before reducing the match overs.
7. If the start of the match is delayed, the match overs shall be reduced at a rate of 1 over for every 5 full minutes delayed. If only one team was ready to play at the scheduled time of the toss, that team would be declared to have won the toss. The captain or the designee of the team winning the toss shall announce to the umpires in the presence of the opposing team’s captain, whether they elect to bat or bowl first. If the start of the match is delayed due to one team not being ready to play at the scheduled time for the toss, that team’s innings would be reduced at a rate of 1 over for every 5 full minutes delayed. The team that was ready to play at the scheduled time of the toss, innings would not be reduced.
8. If the start of the match is delayed due to one team not ready to play for more than 1 hour, that team would be considered to have forfeited the match and the team who was present and ready to play would be awarded full points from the match. If the start of the



match is delayed due to both teams not being ready to play for more than 1 hour, both teams would be considered to have forfeited the match and no team would be awarded any points.

9. To constitute a match, both teams' innings should be a minimum of five overs.
10. Matches reduced in overs due to GWL issues shall have the result determined by Duckworth Lewis Stern Method.
11. All the laws of cricket, including Law 36, leg before wicket (LBW) will be applied to all matches in this tournament.
12. Each team is required to have a scorer proficient in scoring using the tournament's scoring app.
13. Each team will play each other once in league play
14. The top seeded team shall be determined first by points. If teams are tied on points the following will be used to break the tie. First, Net Run Rate, followed by most wins, followed by winner of head to head match.

Play-offs

1. At the completion of all league matches, the top four (4) seeded teams will go to the semi-finals. Semi-final #1 will be played between seed #1 and seed #4. Semi-final #2 will be played between seed #2 and seed #3. The winner of semi-final #1 will play the winner of semi-final #2 in the finals. The winner of the final will be declared JCCricket GA High School Cricket Spring Tournament Champions.
