What is Cricket?


Cricket is a bat-and-ball game played between two teams of 11 players on a field, at the centre of which is a rectangular 22-yard long pitch. One team bats, trying to score as many runs as possible while the other team bowls and fields, trying to dismiss the batsmen and thus limit the runs scored by the batting team. A run is scored by the striking batsman hitting the ball with his bat, running to the opposite end of the pitch and touching the crease there without being dismissed. The teams switch between batting and fielding at the end of innings.

In professional cricket the length of a game ranges from 20 over's of six bowling deliveries per side to Test cricket played over five days. The Laws of Cricket are maintained by the International Cricket Council (ICC) with additional Standard Playing Conditions for Test matches and One Day Internationals.

Cricket was first played in southern England in the 16th century. By the end of the 18th century, it had developed into the national sport of England. The expansion of the British Empire led cricket being played overseas and by the mid-19th century the first international matches were being held. The ICC, the game's governing body, has ten full members.

The game is played particularly in Australia, Asia, Indian subcontinent, West Indies, Southern Africa, Canada, USA and England.

For those who are not familiar with MCA MCA stands for **Madison Cricket Association** which is a non-profit recreation league established in 2011 to conduct hard tennis ball cricket in Madison, Wisconsin, for all cricket enthusiasts and to help Madison community.
