COVID19 Response Group

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
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COVID19 Screening Team (On Site)

Team Captains and Umpire are responsible for on-site screening and reporting symptoms to COVID19 response group.

COVID19 Response Process Flow (Game Day – On Site)



*COVID19 response plan is a preliminary document based on current scenario. As the situation changes we plan to update the document based on guidelines provided by CDC and State of Michigan.

COVID19 Guidelines

1. Players/umpires must not participate if they have the following symptoms:
 - a. Fever • 100.4° F [38.0° C] or greater, have signs of a fever, and any other symptoms for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing or other symptom-altering medicines (e.g. cough suppressants).
 - b. Shortness of breath (not severe)
 - c. Cough
 - d. Chills
 - e. Repeated shaking with chills
 - f. Muscle pain
 - g. Headache
 - h. Sore throat
 - i. New loss of taste or smell
 - j. Any other symptoms added by the CDC
2. Players/umpires must complete the screening form prior to participating in the game.
3. Players/umpires maintain 6ft social distancing outside the field (playing area).
4. Players/umpires not share equipment, water bottles etc.
5. Players/umpires not to shake hands or indulge in any celebration which violates 6ft social distancing rule.
6. Players are responsible to carry hand sanitizers and apply prior to start of the game, during innings break and after the game.
7. All other COVID19 guidelines related to the game scenario will be followed as per ICC guidelines and are detailed in the rules document.
